



## The Word of God

THE FIRST READING

The people sit.

Exodus 34:29-35

Reader A reading from the Book of Exodus.

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the

Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

## The Rite of Baptism

### THE PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The baptismal candidates and their families remain in the pews for the presentation and examination of candidates.

Presider The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The candidates are presented individually by their parents and godparents:

Parents and godparents *I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.*

After all are presented, the presider asks the whole group of parents and godparents:

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and godparents *I will, with God's help.*

Presider Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and godparents *I will, with God's help.*

The presider then asks the following questions of any candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer *I renounce them.*

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*I renounce them.*

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*I renounce them.*

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior? *I do.*

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? *I do.*

Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord? *I do.*

The presider then addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People **We will.**

## THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Presider Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father Almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

Presider Do you believe in God the Son?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.**

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**I will, with God's help.**

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

**I will, with God's help.**

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

**I will, with God's help.**

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of the earth and every human being?

**I will, with God's help.**



#### THE BAPTISM

Each candidate is presented by name to an assisting priest or deacon,  
who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

*N.*, I baptize you in the Name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The baptizer places a hand on the child's head, marking on their forehead the sign of the Cross with Chrism, saying:

*N.*, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in baptism  
and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

After all have been baptized:

Presider Let us pray. Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Presider Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All **We receive you into the household of God.  
Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,  
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**
