One	Tues, July 11	San Francisco - Montgomery, Alabama	Travel Day. Reflection and recreation time in the evening.
Two	Weds, July 12	Montgomery, Alabama	We visit sites that reflect histories of oppression and resistance in the US: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Legacy Museum: From Slavery to Mass Incarceration: The Museum “provides a comprehensive history of the United States with a focus on the legacy of slavery”. • “Rosa Parks’ Bus-stop”: Memorial at the location of the stop where Rosa Parks boarded the bus and changed history on the evening of December 1, 1955. Three	Thurs, July 13	Montgomery, Alabama	We visit two sites that reflect speak to histories of oppression and resistance in the US: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The National Memorial for Peace and Justice: The nation’s first memorial dedicated to people of color who have been impacted by slavery, lynching, racial segregation, Jim Crow, and contemporary presumptions of guilt and police violence. • The Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church: The historic church led by The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., from 1954-1960. Reflection and Recreation Time.
Four	Fri, July 14	Montgomery, Alabama – Macon, GA. – Savannah, GA.	Travel to Macon where we share a meal with the St. Francis Episcopal Church youth group. We travel on to stay in Savannah.

Five	Sat, July 15	Savannah, Georgia	<p>Visit sites in Savannah including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First African Baptist Church, Savannah: Constituted in 1777 and home to one of the oldest African American Congregations in the US, this church served as a “stop” on the Underground Railroad • The Beach Institute African American Cultural Center: Originally the first school in Savannah built specifically for African Americans, in 1867, now a center for African American History and Art <p>Recreation Time at Tybee Island Beach.</p>
Six	Sun, July 16	Savannah, Georgia	<p>Church Service and time with Youth Group at St. Peter’s Episcopal Church, Savannah</p> <p>Visit Pin Point Heritage Museum: A site that celebrates the Gullah/Geechee community that has lived in Pin Point for over a hundred years.</p> <p>Recreation Time at Butter Bean Beach.</p>
Seven	Mon, July 17	Savannah, Georgia - Atlanta, Georgia	Brunch in Savannah before we travel to Atlanta.
Eight	Tues, July 18	Atlanta to San Francisco	<p>Visit National Center for Civil and Human Rights in Atlanta.</p> <p>Leisure time in Atlanta before flying back to San Francisco.</p>
